Earnest Edgar Huff, 79, a retired farmer and rancher, died Tuesday, Feb. 14, 2012, at Hillcrest Nursing Home in McCook.

He was born Nov. 13, 1932, at the home of his parents, Vance and Erna (Zimmerman) Huff, near Lyle in northeast Decatur County and was reared on the family farm. He attended Spring Branch School and graduated from Decatur Community High School in 1952.

He married Donna Marie Mc-Clure on Oct. 25, 1953, in Oberlin, and they moved to a farm in the Lyle area. He served in the Army from 1955 to 1957, and while he was stationed at Vashon Island, his wife lived in Seattle. After his honorable discharge, the couple returned to their farm.

He started helping his father on the family farm at an early age and enjoyed farming for most of his adult life. He was a Jehovah's Witness and a past Grant Township trustee.

Survivors include his wife, Mc-Cook; two sons, Elden (Charissa) Huff, Lebanon, Neb., and David Huff, West Point, Neb.; two sistersin-law, Bobbie Strauss, Grand Junction, Colo., and Billie (Rex) Morton, Sahuarita, Ariz.; a grandson; and a great-granddaughter.

mechanic for Koch Oil Co., died Tuesday, Feb. 14, 2012, at Community Hospital in McCook.

He was born July 19, 1934, in Liberty Township, Decatur County, the third son of Lawrence Henry and Gladys Rosa (Penn) Marshall. He attended West Liberty School through the second grade. The family moved to Lincoln, Neb., where he finished school. After his mother died in 1944, he moved back to Decatur County and lived with his grandfather, Andy Penn.

He served as a staff driver at 5th Army Headquarters in Chicago from January 1955 through his discharge in December 1956.

He married Reva Snyder on Dec. 24, 1959, in Oberlin. They moved to Syracuse and he worked on a farm for Arthur "Pete" Burns for 10 years. He raised his own hogs until he was hurt in a farm accident Dec.8, 1969, after which the family moved back to Decatur County. He began working for Bill Matchett at his welding shop in 1971.

In 1973, he took a job as mechanic for Koch Oil, where he worked for 25 years until he retired in 1998. He opened a repair shop in Oberlin in 1998, where he did repairs on small engines and sold antiques, but sold it in 2004 when his health began to fail.

He had a passion for antique cars and tractors and restored several cars, but his 1927 Chevy and 1928 Whippet were his pride and joy. He was a member of the Mini Sappa


