

Wrestlers win regional tournament

Six boys qualify for state

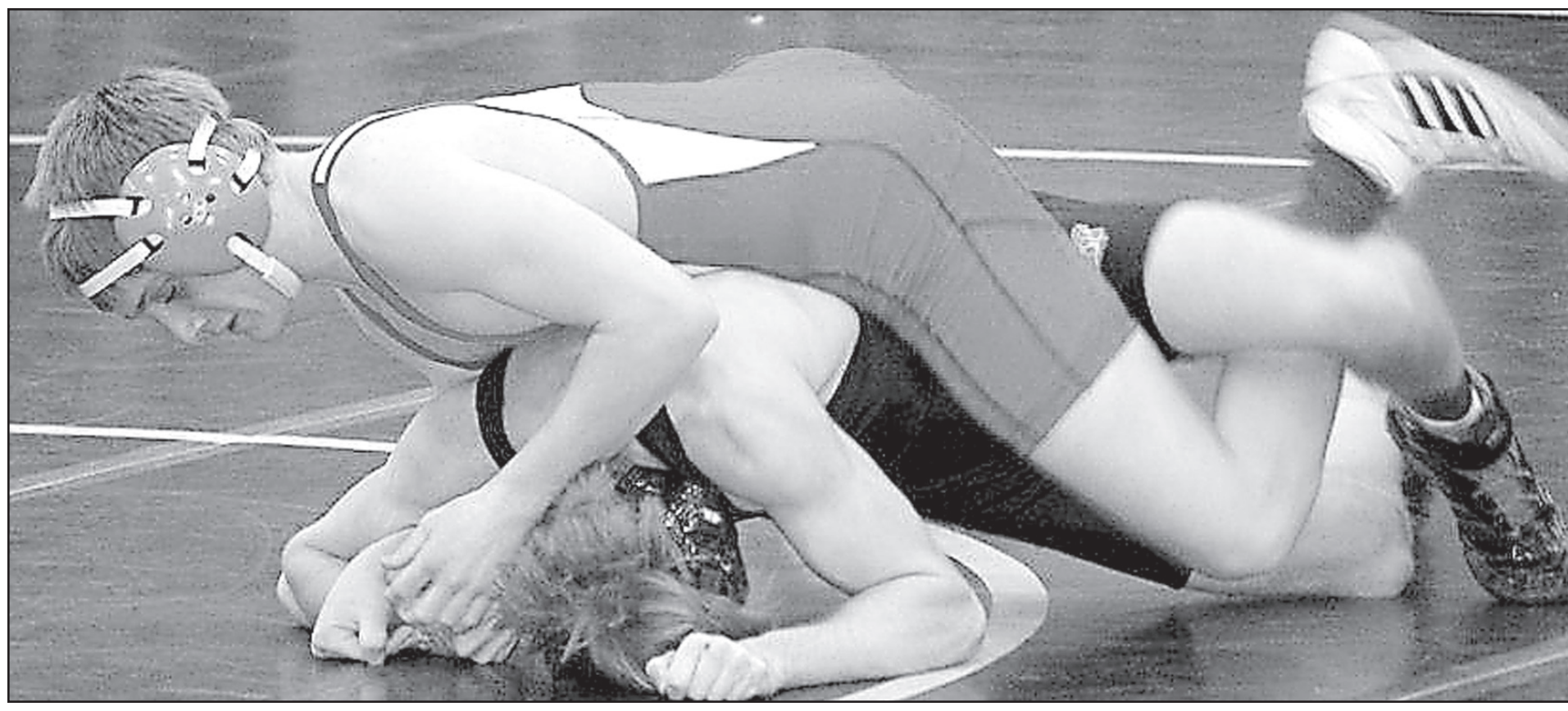
Oberlin will be sending six wrestlers to the state tournament in Hays this week after the Decatur Community High team took first place at the regional wrestling tournament in Lakin on Friday and Saturday.

Oberlin had one champion, four runners up and a fourth-place finisher, all of whom qualify for state. (The first four places in each weight class get to go.)

Junior Kade Brown took first place at 145 pounds. Last year, Brown took fourth place at the state tournament at 135 pounds.

Senior Brent Juenemann took second at 132 pounds. Last year, he took fourth at state, and as a sophomore, he placed fifth.

Sophomore Dayton Dreher came in second at 126 pounds. Last year, Dreher came in third at the state tournament at 112 pounds.

Senior Jeff Shaw came in second at 195 pounds. This will be his first trip to state.

Junior Channing Fortin took second at 220 pounds. Last year, Fortin went to state at 215 pounds but did not place.

Freshman Troy Juenemann took fourth to win a trip to state.

state meet, Coach Joe Dreher said. Oberlin beat out 23 other schools to win the regional meet. The Red Devils had 134 points, while Goodland had 133, Scott City 130.5, Hoxie 121, Norton 114.5, Oakley 105.5, Phillipsburg 84, St. Francis

81, Plainville 74.5, Rawlins County 43, Thomas More Prep of Hays 52.5, Holcomb 38.5, Leoti 29, Cimarron 22, Lakin 22, Sublette 21, Stockton 18, South Gray 15, Elkhart 13, Quinter 11, Hill City 10, Meade 3 and Trego Community 1.

Oberlin boys beat Logan Trojans

The Decatur Community High boys basketball team downed the Logan Trojans 76-30 in front of the home crowd last Tuesday.

The Oberlin boys thrilled the fans with a 23-7 first quarter, then outscored Logan 20-14 in the second for a 43-21 lead at the half.

In the third period, Oberlin scored 21 to Logan's 9 and in the fourth, the Red Devils shut out the Trojans while scoring 12.

While the Oberlin boys shot well from the field, they were only five

for 15 from the free throw line. The win takes them up to 7 wins and 10 losses this season.

Scoring for Oberlin were Dalton Jones, 21 including two three pointers; Zach May, 21 including three three-point shots; Tyler Shields, 14 including two three pointers; Tyler Bruggeman and Shane McEvoy, 8 each; and Ryan May, 4

Bruggeman was the top rebounder with 13 followed by Z. May and Jones, 10 each; R. May, seven; McEvoy and Shields, six; Garrett

Berry, three; and Kyle Breth and Konner Fortin, one each.

Jones had the most assists with six, followed by Z. May, five; Shields, three; Bruggeman, two; and Breth and R. May, one each.

Z. May had four blocked shots and Shields one. Z. May and Jones each had six steals while R. May and Shields had two each.

The junior varsity played two quarters, with Oberlin winning 38-29.

Oberlin started off strong in the

first quarter, outscoring Logan 24-9, but the Trojans came back in the second and hit three three-point shots plus four twos and three free throws to outscore Oberlin 20-14.

Scoring for Oberlin were Breth, 13 including a pair of three pointers; Kaine Fredrickson, 8 including two three pointers; Regent Erickson, 6 and Kennedy Fortin, 6 including a three pointer; Kelden Breth, 4 including a three-point shot; and Ganon Henningson, 1.
