Lease may bring new equipment

The Decatur County commissioners talked with an equipment salesman about a five-year lease on four road graders and a loader.

Dustin Daniels, with Foley Equipment from Wichita, presented the lease to the commissioners and county attorney at the meeting Feb. 28.

The idea is to trade in six of the county's current graders and one loader for four newer Caterpillar motor graders and one loader.

The agreement, said Commissioner Ralph Unger, would be a five-year lease with a \$1 buyout at

the end. Payments will be \$138,404 a year for five years.

County Attorney Steve Hirsch took the lease agreement to look over.

In other business, the commissioners:

• Heard that the hospital board has reorganized with Pam Wilson as the new chairman; and Gary Walter as treasurer.

• Talked about setting up interviews for the job of courthouse maintenance supervisor and cus-

todian.

• Decided to change the Saturday landfill is open in April because of Easter weekend.

The landfill is normally open from 8 a.m. to noon the first Saturday of the month. Instead it will be closed on Saturday, April 7, and open on Saturday, April 14.
