

Girls win meet

The Decatur Community High school girls track team won the Norton Invitational on Thursday while the boys came in fourth.

The Lady Red Devils took first with 143 points while Colby came in second with 127, followed by Norton 112.5, Smith Center 81, Goodland 22, Logan 21.5 and Northern Valley 17.

Smith Center won the boys division with 119 points, followed by Goodland 104, Norton 91, Oberlin 87, Colby 52, Northern Valley 42 and Logan, 31.

Miki Dorshorst led the Oberlin girls with a pair of first places, a second and a first as part of the 4x400-meter relay team.

Alexis Hissong, Kiah Blau and Kayla Jones also came in first for the Oberlin girls in their events.

Dalton Jones was the only Oberlin boy to take a first. He also helped the 4x800-meter relay team take first and the 4x400-meter relay team take second.
