Shows are normally shown at 7 p.m. on Friday and Saturday at 2 p.m. on Sunday.

Last to get finished was the bowling alley.

Through the tireless work of Economic Development Corp. member Greg Lohoefner, the lanes were finally opened in March 2011 with the latest in equipment. Shoes can be rented for \$1 and bowling is \$3 a game with league bowling

discounted to \$2.50.

Pizza and snacks are also available with volunteers helping out.

There is a glass door between the bowling alley and the theater and games are available in both for children, teenagers and adults.

It took a while, but the three-prong project is done. Oberlin has a great new facility for its seniors, a first-rate theater and a popular new bowling alley all on Penn Ave. on the north end of downtown.
