# Obituaries

### Donald W. Bouts

Donald W. Bouts, 86, a 1942 graduate of Jennings High School, died Tuesday, May 22, 2012, at Desert Health and Rehab in Colby.

He was born Aug. 22, 1925, in Jennings, the son of Anton and Leona Bouts. He attended country schools. After graduating from high school, he joined his parents, who had moved to Los Angeles, and waited for his 18th birthday, when he enlisted in the Army Air Corps. While in the military, he went to England from a base at Kearney, Neb., and served as a tail gunner on a B-17.

Following the war, he married Barbara Henigar on Oct. 18, 1947, in Los Angeles. They moved to the family farm south of Jennings, where they farmed for five years. In 1954, they moved to Denver, where he worked at the United Airlines training center for 36 years, until retiring as a simulator trainer instructor in 1990. In 2002, they moved to Colby.

Survivors include his wife, Colby; a son, Will (Grace) Bouts, Oberlin; two daughters, Cathy Bouts, Oberlin, and Judy (Jeff) Burns, Centennial, Colo.; a brother, Frank Bouts, Selden; four sisters, Marian Martin and Lora Morris, Denver; Joan Rogers, Wheat Ridge, Colo.; and Carolyn Nowenkunski, South Carolina; and four grandsons. No services are planned.

He was born Dec. 23, 1919, at the family farm nine miles south of Oberlin, the son of Tolle and Janie (Penn) Hoppas. He attended Summit School. He lived with his aunt Alice Cullison in Oberlin all four years of high school. After graduating, he remained on the family farm with his parents and helped his mother care for his father and continued to work on the farm all of his life. He moved to town in 2003. After a fall, he moved to the nursing home in late 2010.

Survivors include five nieces, Phyllis (Doran) Moyer, Brush, Colo.; Alice (Joe) Kasson, Wilsonville, Neb.; Janet (Harvey) Jacoby, Loveland, Colo.; Glenna (Terry) Clapper, Vona, Colo.; and Merla (Dennis) Stanke, Goodland; and two nephews, Don White and Ronald White, both of Aurora, Colo.

He was preceded in death by his parents; two sisters, Estel Macy and Nellie White; a brother, Virgil Hoppas; and two nephews, Ray White and Steven Hoppas.

Services were to be Tuesday at Pauls Funeral Home with the Rev. Kirk Kasson officiating and burial in the Oberlin Cemetery.

A memorial was established to the Decatur County Museum in care of the funeral home, 121 N. Penn, Oberlin, Kan., 67749.

### Dale D. Young

Dale Devere Young, 88, a longtime Oberlin businessman and owner of Young Construction Co. and Dale's Fish 'N' Fun, died Saturday, June 2, 2012, in Oberlin.

He was born April 5, 1924, in Rimersburg, Pa., the son of William James and Lizzie Grace (Switzer) Young. He grew up in Emlenton,

Pa., attended Rimersburg Grade School and graduated from Emlenton High School.

During World War II, he served with the Army Air Corps and reached the rank of staff sergeant. While stationed at the McCook Army Air Base, he met his future wife, Eris Wenger. They married Dec. 28, 1945, at the Lund Covenant Church southwest of Oberlin in a ceremony officiated by her grandfather, the Rev. Edward Anderson.

They lived in Oberlin all of their married life. They were business partners in Young Construction and later in a wholesale/retail sporting goods company, Dale's Fish 'N' Fun, which they started in 1961. They retired in 1984, turning the business over to their sons-in-law.

Mr. Young was a member of the Oberlin United Methodist Church. Survivors include a son, Gary (Nancy) Young, Manhattan; two daughters, Candace (Joe) Dejmaj, and Terri (Bob) Woolsey, all of Oberlin; eight grandchildren; and 15 great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his wife on June 8, 2011; his parents; two brothers, Chester Campbell and Frank Cowan; and two sisters, Amanda Stahlman-McGinnis and Zelia Campbell Anthony Martin.

Funeral services will be at 10:30 a.m. today at the church in Oberlin. The Rev. Linda Willey will officiate and burial will be in the Oberlin Cemetery with military rites by the Oberlin American Legion Post.

A memorial was established to the church, in care of Pauls Funeral Home, 121 N. Penn, Oberlin, Kan., 67749.

received a ticket for improper backing and not wearing a seat belt.

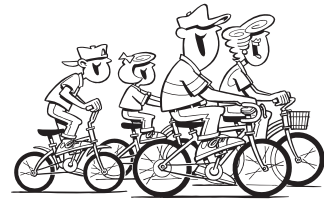
• The Decatur Co-op reported theft of a staff cell phone at 6:55 p.m. Thursday at the American Legion Hall. The theft of the Motorola Milestone X Droid was caught on camera, and the man had previously told a patron where he worked in Salina. Chief Lockhart then obtained the suspect's address from his employer and called the Salina Police Department to arrest him. The phone is being returned along with a report on the incident. Pending that report, the chief said, formal charges will be filed.

• A domestic disturbance was reported Sunday at 105 S. Elk Ave., home of Lipton Joseph Rivet, 38. The incident occurred between 3 p.m. and 5:46 p.m. and involved a 44-year-old woman. This is Mr. Rivet's second offense, Chief Lockhart said, and he is in jail with a bond of \$2,000. He was charged with

domestic battery and criminal damage to property, both misdemeanors. The criminal damage was the broken glass of a storm door. When previously charged, Mr. Rivet pled not guilty but was convicted. If he pleads guilty or is convicted for this incident, the chief said, he will have to spend a minimum of 90 days in jail.

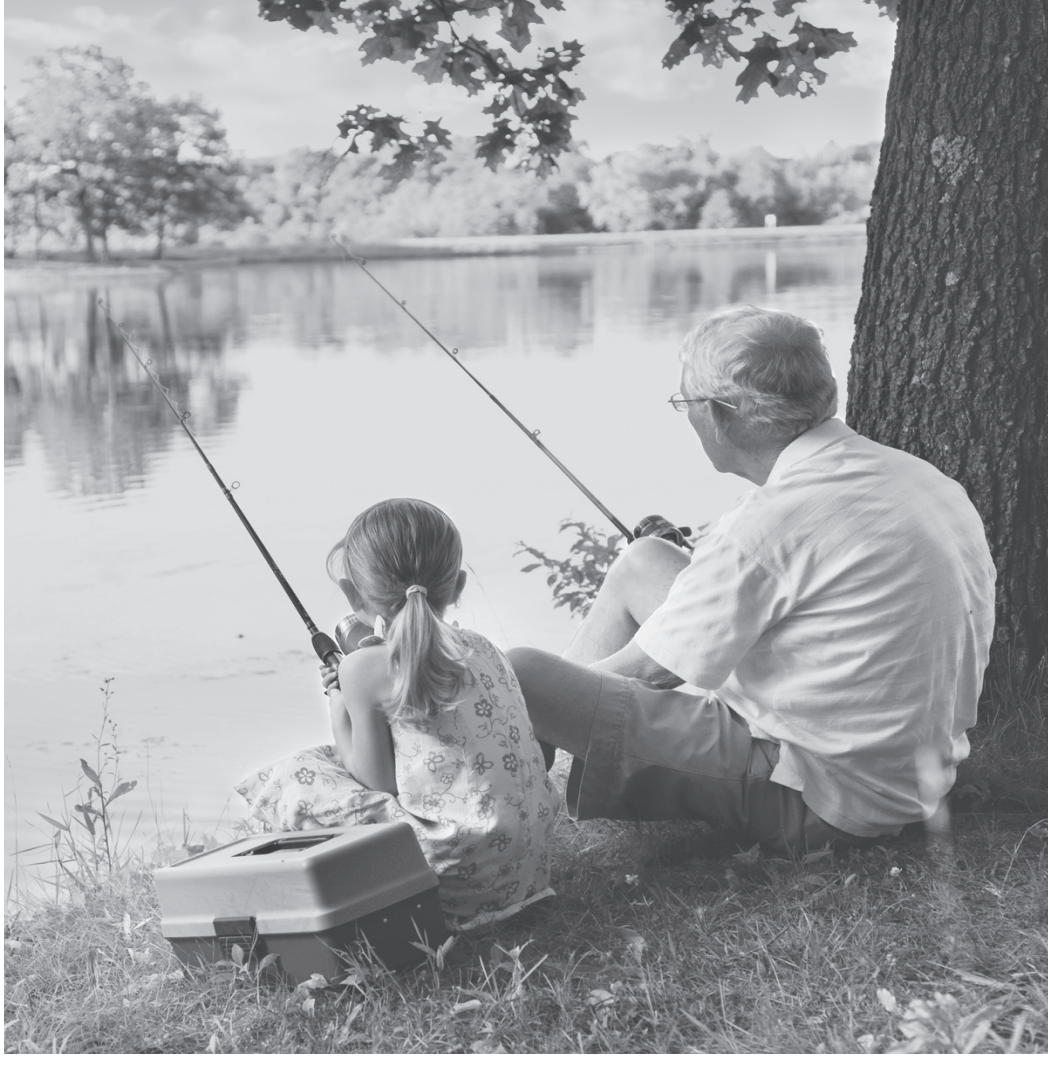
