Man held in kidnapping case

A 33-year-old Oberlin man was arrested for kidnapping, aggravated child endangerment and aggravated battery against a law enforcement officer after a disturbance last Wednesday.

Chris Kelley of 206 N. York, Apt. 1, Oberlin, was arrested and charged Wednesday evening with five counts of kidnapping and four counts of aggravated child endangerment. He also faces one count of aggravated battery against a law enforcement officer and one count of interference with law enforcement, for a total of 11 felonies.

As of Monday, Kelley was still in jail with a \$500,000 bail out bond. A preliminary hearing was set for

10 a.m. Friday, June 15, in Decatur County District Court.

The assault charge involved Oberlin Police Officer Troy Haas. Reports show Police Chief Wade Lockhart, Sheriff Ken Badsky and Decatur County Deputy Sheriff Jay Tate also responded to the call.

The kidnapping charges allege that Mr. Kelley confined or held a woman and their four children with the intent to hold them hostage. The child endangerment charges referred to the same children. No injuries were reported.

Neither the police department nor the sheriff had any comment on the incident.

He was born April 2, 1920, in St. Francis, the son of J.W. Dorsey and Eva Pearl (Slagle) DeGood. He married Bertha Holzwarth on Aug. 13, 1942, and they had two sons. His wife died Dec. 16, 1983.

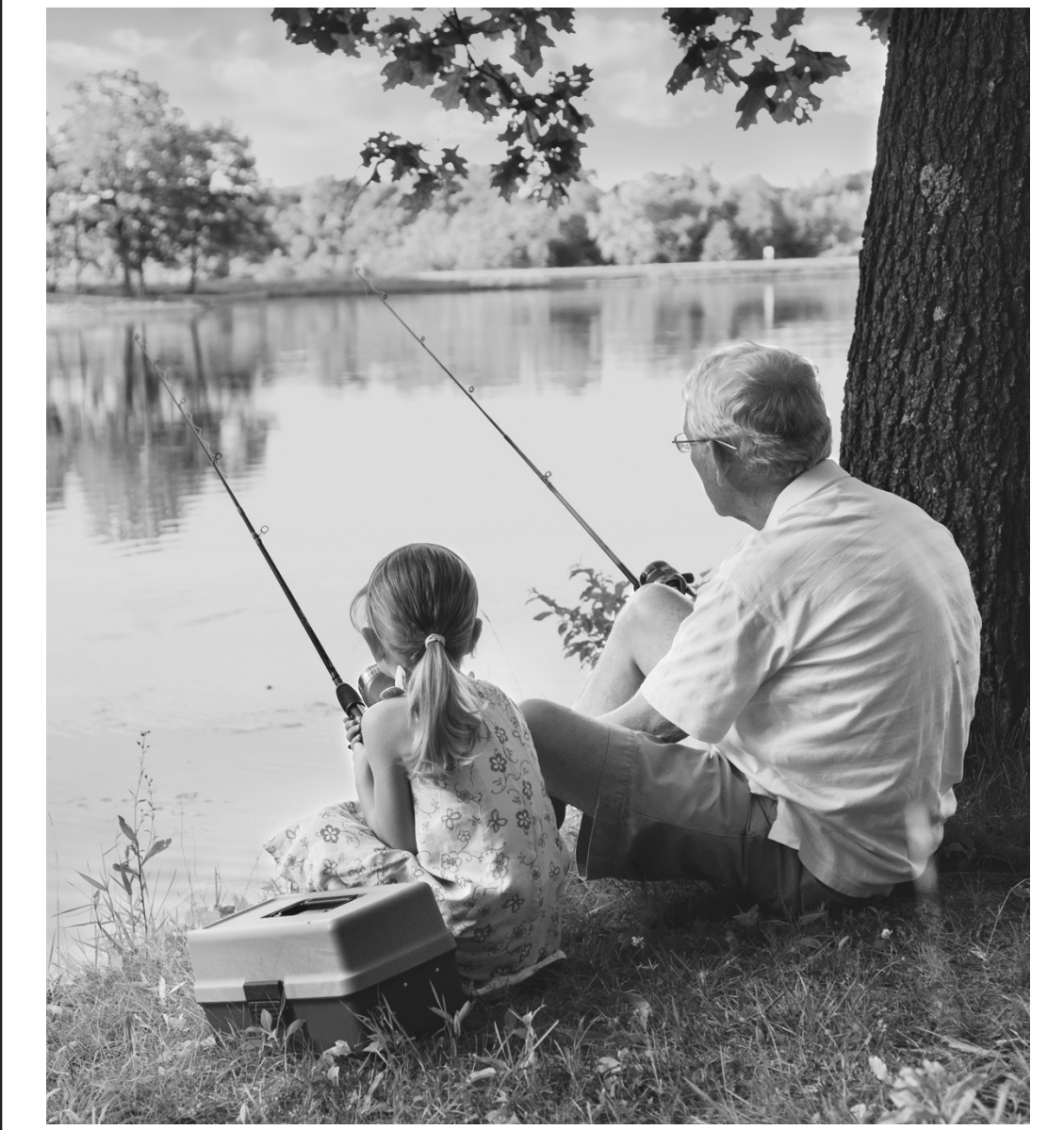
