"I will spend mornings servicing computers for customers in their homes or at the office," he said. "I do service work for several businesses, as well as some city, county and church offices."

A 1959 graduate of Decatur Community High School, Mr. Carman attended McCook Community College for two years, majoring in business. He started his career working
