It's been a real whirlwind of activity here at Decatur Health Systems lately, and it's not slowing down yet.

Last week, of course, was filled with the Decatur County Fair. It was a lot of fun to see everyone who stopped by our booth at the commercial building each night. Everyone was invited to say hello to our board members, pick up a pill box to help keep track of any medications and get some free sunscreen for these hot summer days.

While we were at it, we passed out information about Dr. Allen Hooper, who is in town starting this week already to assist our full-time midlevel providers. He will be competing in our golf tournament this Saturday as well.

Tickets for the prime-rib dinner are still available. In addition to the meal, attendees will get a chance at everything up for auction. The hospital board officially offered him a contract today, and he will be at Decatur Health one week later.

That's excellent news for everyone here. It's a huge undertaking to come in and assume a critical job like that of a temporary hospital administrator, and having someone in that position who knows the people here, and who cares about this town, puts us in the best possible position as we look for someone to fill the job permanently.

So starting next Monday, if you see Mr. Myers around town, be sure to say hello, welcome him back, and thank him for what he's doing for Oberlin.
