## Brothers will coach at Colby college

colby.sports@nwkansas.com Oberlin native Rusty Grafel has been promoted to head the men's basketball program at Colby Community College following the resignation of Coach Dustin Pfeifer earlier this month.

The appointment was confirmed by the college board at a special meeting last Monday on the recommendation of President Steve Vacik, who said the college had conduced "a brief internal search." Coach Grafel will begin his duties immediately as the 14th head coach of the Trojans.


"We're really excited," Grafel, who had been the assistant coach, said of both himself and his players, who were set to show up in Colby on Saturday. "Obviously, we had so many sophomores last year, so we're bringing in a lot of new guys, but they're excited."

One of Grafel's first duties was hiring an assistant coach, and he said he's decided to bring in his brother, Egan. Both are graduates of Decatur Community High School, Rusty in 2002 and Egan in 2004. Both were stars for the Red Devils' basketball team.

Egan Grafel played at Cloud County Community College for two years, and then transferred to Northern Illinois University in DeKalb, Ill., where he played basketball and completed his degree.

Rusty Grafel served as assistant coach for the men's program for three seasons.

"I am very pleased that Coach Grafel has accepted the head coaching job," said Athletic Director Ryan Sturdy. "He has an excellent record as a great recruiter for the program. His

played three years for the Tigers and was part of the 2005-06 Rocky Mountain Athletic Association Championship Team that was ranked No. 1 in the nation. Grafel stayed at Fort Hays as a graduate assistant coach for the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons.

When Dustin Pfeifer got the job as head coach at Colby in 2009-10, he hired Grafel as his assistant. Pfeifer didn't say why he was resigning, Grafel said.

"He just took a different route with his life," the new coach

The Colby men finished the 2011-12 season 19-12 overall and 7-10 in the Western Division of the Jayhawk Conference.

Coach Grafel earned bachelor's and master's degrees in health and human performance from Fort Hays.

He said it's always been in his plan to become a head coach.

"I've always wanted to be a head coach," he said, "When I first decided I wanted to be a coach ... I knew I kind of fell in that realm."

Rusty Grafel said this is his brother's first college coaching job. After graduating from Northern Illinois, his brother said, Egan was thinking about playing overseas and traveled to various cities before settling down in Colby.

The coaches' parents are Keith and Roma Grafel of Council Grove, formerly of Oberlin, and their grandparents are Don and Joan Grafel of Herndon. Both parents worked for the Oberlin Schools while they lived here.

A fun fact, Grafel said, is that his dad, a long-time coach and teacher, played on the men's basketball team at Colby before graduating in 1969.
