# \*Newcomer wants to save city's money

(Continued from Page 1A) time he has been called on to defend the Constitution of the United Navy, he said, touring the Mediterranean and Red seas and serving in

Operation Desert Storm. Mr. Bowen said his goals are clear: He wants to save money, cut expenses and curtail city ordinances that he sees as a violation of constitutional rights.

"I'd like to stop the hemorrhaging," he said, "the money going out of here the last year is ridiculous ... I think the pool project is a waste of money. I think our current pool could be repiped and be just fine. The city can't afford \$2.5 million right now.

"The current ordinance (on blighted property) is a clear violation of our constitutional rights – it's against the law to refuse right of entry, specifically. And that's against the Fourth Amendment.

"Right of entry is about when she (Jan Ackerman, the code enforcement officer employed by the city to enforce the blighted property ordinance) can enter a property, and according to our ordinance, it says that 'it shall be a violation of this code to deny the officer the right of access and entry of private property ...,' which is against the Fourth and Fifth Amendments, and Article 15 of the Kansas Bill of Rights."

The Fourth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution guards against unreasonable searches and seizures, and also requires a warrant for these, cause. The Fifth protects citizens

from abuse of government authority Mr. Bowen said this is not the first in legal procedures. And lastly, Article 15 of the Kansas Bill of Rights states the "right of the people to be States. He served 15 years in the secure in their persons and property against unreasonable searches and seizures shall be inviolate; and no warrant shall issue but on probable cause, supported by oath or affirmation, particularly describing the place to be searched and the persons or property to be seized."

Mr. Bowen said he moved here from Central City, Colo. He lived there for seven years and in Denver for 14. He bought a house in Oberlin when his mother fell ill, and he came home to take care of her. She has since passed away, but Mr. Bowen remained, working as a handyman. His father, Marlin Bowen, owns Cabin Antiques.

"It's a great town," he said about Oberlin, "but when I moved here, it seemed a lot better than it does now. I felt that people were a lot more friendly than they are today, and I don't understand why.

"I'm kind of hoping to pull the community together, and I would like to see a Community Day, like one day out of the month when we all get together and help these people with blighted properties. I think we need a date and time to come out and do it - something solid for people to plan around."


