James Lee Ater, 83, Hilo, Hawaii, a 1947 graduate of Decatur Community High School, died Thursday, Aug. 16, 2012, at the Yukio Okutsu State Veterans Home.

He was born on Feb. 15, 1929, in Oberlin, the son of Fred and Velma (Barnes) Ater. He was a marine electrician for Kems Inc. on Oahu before he retired. He was a member of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers. He was a U.S. Navy veteran of the Korean War and made Koa wood crafts.

Allen 'Bus' Wurm

Allen Mathias "Bus" Wurm, 88, a retired farmer and World War II veteran, died Aug. 19, 2012, at the Decatur County Hospital in Oberlin.

He was born Sept. 8, 1923, at the family farm near Traer, the son of Matt and Alcia Murriel (Herzog) Wurm. He grew up on a farm northeast of Oberlin in Sherman Township, where his family moved in 1926. He attended a country school near his home and graduated from Decatur Community High School in 1940. He was a veteran of World War II, serving as an instructor at the Armored Division School in Fort Knox, Ky.

He married Carolyn Nelson on July 24, 1949, at the United Methodist Church in Oberlin. They made their home on the Wurm family farm until moving to town in 1988. At an early age, he and his brother helped their father on the family farm, and he continued to farm for most of his adult life.

He was a life member and past commander of the Oberlin American Legion Post and a member of the Mini-Sappa Antique Engine and Thresher Club, which he had helped start. He enjoyed working on old tractors and flying airplanes.

Survivors include his wife; a son, Ward Allen Wurm; a granddaughter, Alicia Wurm; and a sister-in-law, Rachel Wurm, all of Oberlin; and a brother-in-law, Wayne Fisher, Albuquerque, N.M.

He was preceded in death by his parents; a brother, Phillip "Rex" Wurm; and a sister, Helene Fisher.

Funeral services were Friday morning at Pauls Funeral Home in Oberlin. Pastor Charlotte Strecker-Baselor officiated; burial was in the Oberlin Cemetery with military graveside rites by the Oberlin American Legion.

A memorial was established to the Antique Club, in care of the funeral home, 121 N. Penn, Oberlin, Kan., 67749.
