# Oberlin women win league meet

The Decatur Community High All-League runners. girls cross-country team won the Northwest Kansas League championship in Hoxie last Tuesday while the boys came in third.

Both the boys and girls had three runners win medals. Winter Polivka broke a course record by 55 seconds and came in first to be the women's league champion.

Coach Pat Dorshorst said she thought her teams had a fantastic day even though most of the times were slower than the previous

"It was a tough course," she said. "All our runners, boys and girls, competed well. The girls had tough competition with Tribune-Greeley County for the team champion-

"We surprised a lot of people when we had three runners finish before their second runner. It was a fun and very successful day for both our teams.'

Polivka ran the course in 16 minutes, five seconds. The former record holder was Katrina Kaus from Colby, who did it in 17 minutes

Darbi Rouse finished in 17:14 for fifth place and Caitie Shields had 17:25 for seventh.

Matthew Helm was the top runner for the Oberlin boys, finishing the longer course in 20:25.

Ganon Henningson came in 8th in 20:28 and Caleb Koerperich 10th in 20:35 to earn medals.

As medalists, all six were named in Downs.

Others helping the girls to their No. 1 finish were Brittany Urban, 20:21, 18th, and Ashley Witt, 21:47,

Also running for the Oberlin boys were Parker Smith, 21:07, 13th; Justice Harris, 24:02, 23rd; Daniel Lerew, 24:29, 24th; and Timothy Helm, 25:02, 26th.

The Oberlin girls won their race with 27 points, followed by Tribune 33, Hoxie 44, Oakley 45 and Dighton 65.

Tribune won the boys race with 13 points, followed by Leoti 31 and Oberlin 45.

The Hoxie Invitational was run in conjunction with the league meet.

Three Oberlin girls received medals in that race: Polivka, first; Rouse, sixth; and Shields, ninth. M. Helm came in ninth for the Oberlin boys. The scoring was different in the

invitational than in the league meet, Coach Dorshorst said. The first five runners (boys or girls) determined the team score in the invitational. Because of this, Tribune took first in both boys and girls' races and Oberlin finished second in both. Team totals for the Hoxie Invi-

tational were Tribune 18, Oberlin 34, Leoti 44, Hoxie and Palco tied at 55 each, Oakley 88, Wheatland/ Quinter combined 90 and Dighton


