Young team wins game

The Decatur Community Junior High boys opened their basketball season at home Thursday with the seventh graders downing Sharon Springs 40-17 and the eighth graders losing 40-28.

The seventh graders took a 7-5 lead in the first quarter and added to it by outscoring Sharon Springs 12-9 in the second period, 9-1 in the third and 12-2 in the fourth.

"What a great way to start the season," said Coach Tim Breth. "I am very proud of how we played. The team really did a good job playing defense in the second half. Coach (Josh) Williby and I saw good things, but many things we must improve upon."

"I didn't know what to expect since we have never played Sharon Springs before," Coach Breth said. "I have heard they won their league last year and were pretty good."

"The game was a battle. Both teams played extremely hard, but we were the ones who made the most mistakes. Most of our mistakes were normal things for your first game. We gave up too many offensive rebounds. We will get better and would like to play them again."

Red Devils end their season as runners up in District 7

The Decatur Community High football boys and their fans ended the season a long way south of Oberlin as the Red Devils, runners up in District 7, traveled to Meade to play the Buffaloes, the winners of District 8 in Class 2-1A Regional playoffs.

The game was all Meade, however, as the Buffaloes trampled the visiting Red Devils 47-0.

Meade won the coin toss but deferred to Oberlin. After the Red Devils went three and out, the Buffaloes scored on the second play of their drive, taking the ball 44 yards into the end zone. The kick after was no good but the home team led 6-0 after just two minutes and seven seconds.

Later in the first quarter, Meade fumbled the ball and Konnor Fortin recovered for Oberlin, but again the Red Devils were not able to gain any yardage.

With 4:17 left in the first quarter, the Buffaloes scored again and the point-after kick was good.

Just as the quarter ended, Meade struck again, and again the kick after was good. At the end of the first quarter, the Buffs led 20-0.

Oberlin kept trying and got a break. Meade kicked the ball out of bounds and the Red Devils got

to start on their own 35. However, after making a good pass and making the first and 10 on fourth down, Oberlin fumbled and Meade picked up the ball.

A couple of minutes later, the Buffaloes scored again. The kick was good and the score was 27-0.

Oberlin took over on their own 25 and was able to make one first and 10 before an offside call put the Red Devils at third and 12. They couldn't move the ball and Zach May came in to punt.

Meade took the ball on its own 29 but a pass bounced off a Buffalo and was intercepted by Grant Gilliam for Oberlin on the Meade 38.

The Red Devils couldn't move the ball at all, but went for a pass on fourth down and 10 yards. It was unsuccessful and Meade took over again.

It took the Buffaloes a bit longer this time, but they ended up scoring with 42 seconds left in the half. The kick was no good, but they were up 33-0.

The third quarter just added to the Red Devil's woes, as the Buffaloes took the ball and scored with 9:54 left in the quarter. The kick was good and the score was 40-0.

Oberlin was unsuccessful at moving the ball and May again had

to punt. Meade took over on its own 19 and moved forward for its last touchdown with 2:50 left in the quarter. The kick was again good and the Buffaloes led 47-0.

The officials and coaches then agreed to run a continuous clock in the fourth quarter, and neither team was able to score.

The Red Devils ended their season with a 4-6 record while Meade, 9-1, moves on to play Sterling on Friday.

In other Class 2-1A Regional playoff games, Sterling (3-6) beat Smith Center (6-3), 26-16, and Oakley (6-2) beat Johnson (8-1), 14-12. Oakley will play LaCrosse on Friday.

In Class 3A, Norton (7-2) lost to Sacred Heart of Salina (8-1).

In all, Oberlin had four of its six losses to teams that made the regional round of playoffs.
