

# Wrestlers plan to show off skills at alumni dual

The Decatur Community High wrestling team will hit the mats on Monday as the boys, some graduate wrestlers and a few brave fathers will show off their moves during the annual alumni dual starting at 7 p.m. in the high school gym.

Coach Joe Dreher has most of his weight categories filled this year with two seniors, eight juniors, four sophomores and five freshmen on the team, including four who have gone to the state tournament.

The seventh-grade girls downed the Lady Jackrabbits 24-19 on Thursday but the eighth graders lost 36-16.

The Oberlin seventh graders started out ahead of the Tribune girls 8-2 in the first quarter. Each team scored 6 in the second. In the third quarter, Tribune outscored Oberlin 8-6. In the fourth, the Oberlin girls hit 4 to Tribune's 2 for a win.

Scoring were Jenna Randel, 10; Kylie Blau, Lily Marine and Brittney Wesley, 4 each; and Haylee Hilman, 2.

Tribune outscored the Oberlin eighth graders in the first, third and fourth quarters for the 36-16 win.

Scoring for Oberlin were Jakob Blau, Kelsey May and Jenna Long, 4 each, and Randel and Madison Macfee, 2 each.

Last Tuesday, the Oberlin girls were in Atwood.

The seventh graders fell 32-14 to the young Lady Buffaloes.

Oberlin had an 8-6 lead in the first quarter but failed to score in the second as Atwood scored 14 to take a 20-8 lead. In the third quarter, each team hit 4 points and in the fourth, Atwood outscored Oberlin 8-2.

Scoring were Wesley, 8, and K. Blau, Randel and Marine, 2 each.

The eighth grade girls scoring only 2 points against Atwood's 28. Jillian Peters made the only Oberlin score.

The girls will be at home for a 4:30 p.m. tipoff against Dighton on Thursday.

The basketball players all started practice on Monday. Their first games will be on Friday, Nov. 30, at home against the St. Francis Indians.

# Junior high boys win four

The Decatur Community Junior High boys basketball teams beat the Rawlins County Buffaloes and the Greeley County Jackrabbits last week.

On Monday, the Oberlin eighth graders downed Rawlins County 25-24 in a see-saw battle at Atwood while the seventh graders won 27-18.

The eighth graders started out behind 8-5 in the first quarter, but outscored Atwood 6-2 in the second to take an 11-10 lead at the half. In the third quarter, Atwood caught up, outscoring Oberlin 7-6 to tie the score at 17. Then in the fourth quarter, the young Red Devils were able to outplay the Buffaloes 8-7 for the 25-24 victory.

"We escaped with a win," Coach Tim Breth said, "and escaped is the proper word for this game. Rawlins is always hard to beat on their home court. We couldn't hit a shot either."

"Thank goodness, we continue to play good defense. I have to find ways to improve our offense."

Scoring were Dayton Kempt, 7 points; Dante Robertson, 5; Tabor Erickson and Quinton Cook, 4 each; Jeff Juenemann, 3; and Gatlin Hissong, 2.

The seventh graders outscored Atwood in every quarter, 5-4, 7-4, 9-8 and 6-2 for a 27-18 victory.

"It was a wild and crazy game," Coach Breth said. "You get that sometimes when you play on Monday. The players forget things and don't execute as well without a practice prior to playing. If we could have hit a basket, the game would have never been that close."

Scoring were Kole Breth, 13; Kempt, 8; and Kel Grafel and Juenemann, 3 each.

On Thursday, both teams scored big wins in Tribune against Greeley County. The eighth graders won 42-2 and the seventh graders 31-5.

In the eighth-grade game, Oberlin shut out Tribune in three of the four quarters, 13-0, 6-0, 15-2 and 8-0.

"The first quarter, we struggled

shooting the basketball," Coach Breth said. "It was our defense that fueled our offense. We were only five for 20 from the free throw line. In a game like this, we were able to work on some things we've been doing in practice."

Scoring were Hissong, 9 points and three rebounds; Robertson, 8 points and four rebounds; Erickson, 7 points, four rebounds and 10 steals; Juenemann, 6 points, eight rebounds and nine steals; Cook, 5 points and eight rebounds; Kempt, 4 points and five rebounds; and Cade Wurm, 3 points and three rebounds.

In the seventh-grade game, Oberlin outscored the Jackrabbits in every quarter and shut them out in both the second and third, 10-2, 5-0, 10-0 and 6-3.

"We came out with great pressure defense, which caused Tribune to turn over the ball," Coach Breth said. "We used that to get easy shots and jump out to a lead. Bailey Duvall was not able to play due to

an injured ankle."

Scoring were Breth, 14 points, three rebounds and 13 steals; Grafel, 7 points, four rebounds and five steals; A.J. Zillinger, 2 points and three rebounds; Hissong, Erickson and Cook, 2 points each; Jacob Gee, 2 point and four rebounds; and Steven Edminston, 1 point.

The seventh graders now have a 3-0 record and the eighth graders are 2-1.

The boys were to play in Quinter on Tuesday and will be at home with a 4:30 p.m. tipoff against Dighton on Thursday.

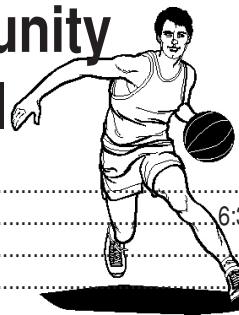
