She was born March 1, 1918, in Herndon, the daughter of Matthias Hartner Jr. and Elizabeth (Huss) Hartner. She attended school in Herndon, graduating from St. Mary's High School in 1935. She then attended a business school in Grand Island, Neb., for two years.
She married Frank Noble Jr. on Dec. 23, 1941, at St. Mary's Cathedral in Grand Island, where they made their home. She was a payroll supervisor at the Veterans Hospital in Grand Island. She was a member of the Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church and the Catholic Daughters.
In 2004, she moved to Hot Springs Village, Ark., to be near family. She moved to the Cedar Living Center four years ago.

He married Rita Tyrrell. He was an equipment operator and farmer and worked at the Norton State Hospital and later as guard at the Norcat Correctional Facility until his retirement. He was a 60-year member of Harmonson-Redd American Legion Post of Norton.

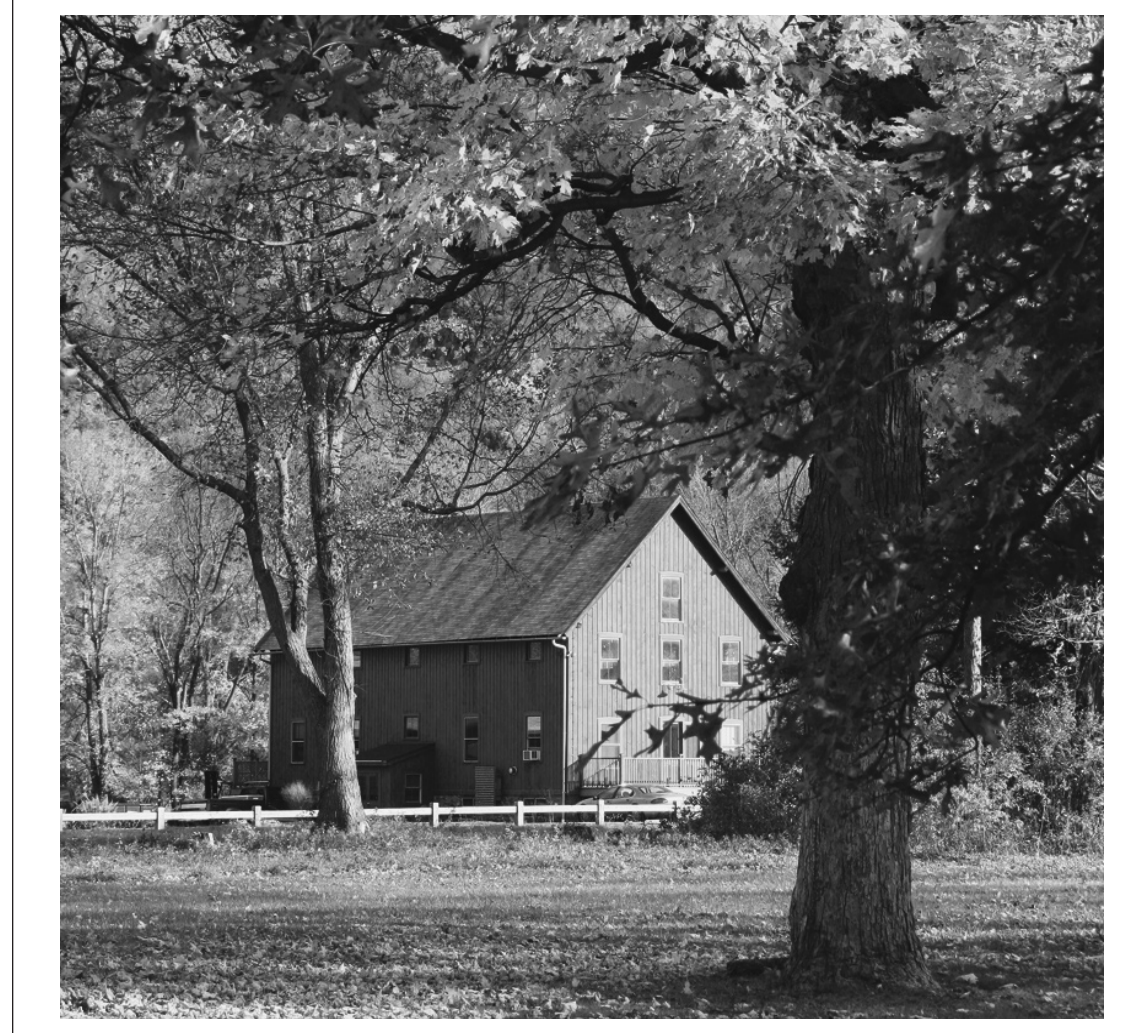
