Not a single stone is being left unturned in the effort of local people to secure a reversal of the order received here Nov. 13 which would move the Oberlin CCC Camp and abandon work at Sappa State Park east of here.

Fire was discovered in the Bassettville school house 18 miles southwest of Oberlin about 11 o'clock Thursday night by Leonard Borthwick and Rea Simpson who were returning home from soliciting Farm Bureau members. They quickly summoned aid and were able to save all the school books, library, piano, desks and stove. The fire seemed to have started next to the flue in the west end of the building as the stove was cold as it had been cleaned of coal and ashes by the teacher, Miss Eulaine Erikson, before she left school for her home. The school building was 52 years old. School will continue in the Bert Feaster residence until further plans are made.
