The Decatur Community High wrestling team came in fourth in the 18-team Colby Dual Tournament last week, first taking second place in its pool Friday by beating Hoxie, 53-26; Hutchinson, 40-33; Scott City, 37-35; and Wray, Colo., 40-33; but losing to Pine Creek from Colorado, 53-27. Then the Red Devils swept the
