# Girls drop game

The Decatur Community High girls won two out of three games in the Cattle Trail Basketball Tournament in McCook over the weekend to take fifth place.

The girls lost their first game to the Southwest Roughriders from Bartley, Neb., 43-27 but came back to win the next two against Maywood and Hayes Center, Neb.

In the first game, played last Tuesday, Southwest was able to outscore the Lady Red Devils in every quarter, 9-8, 10-8, 7-6 and 17-5.

Oberlin started off pretty much keeping up with the Roughriders, as both teams hit four two-point baskets in the first quarter and Southwest added a free throw. In the second, Southwest hit five two-point baskets to three plus two free throws for Oberlin.

In the last quarter, however, the Lady Red Devils were only able to score a single basket and hit three free throws while the Roughriders hit eight baskets and a free throw. All of Southwest's scoring was done by two players, one scored 22 points and the other 21.

Scoring for Oberlin were Shawn Baker, Alexis Hissong and Miki Dorshorst, 7 each, and Demi Murray, 6.

Dorshorst made the team's only three-point shot. Hissong hit five out of six free-throw attempts and Baker sank one of two.

Dorshorst also led the team in assists with three while Hissong had one. Hissong hit five out of six free throws and Baker hit one out of two.

Hannah May was the team's top rebounder with seven followed by Hissong, six; Murray, Dorshorst and Baker, four each; Ara Marine, three; and Morgan Jansonius, one.

Baker had two blocks and May, one. Dorshorst had four steals, Hissong and Murray, three each and Baker and Caitlin Gault, one each.

# Boys take sixth in tourney

The Decatur Community High boys came in sixth at the Cattle Trail Basketball Tournament in McCook last week, losing their first game, winning their second and then losing their bid for fifth place.

In the first game last Tuesday, the Hitchcock County Falcons from Trenton, Neb., downed the Red Devils 47-32.

The Red Devils outscored the Falcons in the first quarter 7-6, but the Nebraska team came back to outscore them 17-7 in the second quarter for a 23-14 lead at the half. The second half was similar, as

Oberlin outscored Trenton 9-8 in the third but the Falcons came back with a 16-9 fourth.

Scoring for Oberlin were Kyle Breth, 10 points including a pair of three pointers, Tyler Bruggeman 9, Ryan May 6, Regent Erickson 3 and Konnor and Kennedy Fortin 2 each.

May hit two of two at the free throw line and Bruggeman sank three of four. Bruggeman and Kennedy Fortin each had two assists and May had one.

Konner Fortin was the team's top rebounder with nine, followed

by May, three; Bruggeman and Noah Nelson, two each; and Breth, Kennedy Fortin and Ganon Henningson, one each.

Bruggeman and May each had three steals while Konnor and Kennedy Fortin had two each and Breth one. Kaine Fredrickson and Henningsen each had a blocked shot.

Breth was named the player of the game.

"Kyle's leadership was very important, helping us get through the tough times and (his) get-it-done attitude is very solid," said Coach Daniel Conrad.

# Oberlin wins second game

The Decatur Community High Red Devils downed the Maywood Tigers 55-32 in the second game of the Cattle Trail Basketball Tournament in McCook on Friday.

Oberlin started out by outscoring the Tigers 17-11 in the first quarter. The Red Devils kept up the pressure as they outscored Maywood 17-9 in the second for a 34-20 lead at the half, 13-10 in the third and 8-2 in the final quarter.

Kyle Breth was named the player of the game for the second time in the tournament.

"Kyle had a great game offensively with 21 points," Coach Daniel Conrad said. "He led the team in leadership and had a strong showing on defense."

Other scorers were Tyler Bruggeman, 9 points; Kennedy Fortin and Ryan May, 6 each; Konnor Fortin, 5; Noah Nelson and Regent Erickson, 3 each; and Keagan Blau, 2. Breth hit five three-point shots while Konnor Fortin and Nelson made one each.

Bruggeman had five assists followed by Kennedy Fortin, four; Konnor Fortin, two; and Kaine Fredrickson and May, one each.

Bruggeman and Erickson each hit one of two free throws they attempted.

Bruggeman was the Red Devils top rebounder with seven, followed by Konnor Fortin, six; May, four; Breth, three; Blau, Erickson and Nelson, two each; and Kennedy Fortin, one.

Bruggeman, Kennedy Fortin, Nelson and Ganon Henningson each had two steals while Erickson, Konnor Fortin and May had one each. Henningson blocked two shots while Breth, Bruggeman and Kennedy Fortin blocked one each.

# Red Devils lose to Hayes Center

The Hayes Center Cardinals edged out the Decatur Community High Red Devils for fifth place in the Cattle Trail Basketball Tournament in McCook on Saturday in a tough, back-and-forth game.

Hayes Center took a 13-8 lead in the first quarter but Oberlin fought back, outscoring the Nebraska team 19-6 in the second for a 27-19 lead at the half. In the second half, however, the Cardinals were able to outscore Oberlin 16-12 in the third and 18-13 in the fourth for a 53-52, one-point victory.

Kelden Breth was named the Decatur Community High player of the game.

"Kelden did a great job of coming off the bench and nailing key threes," Coach Daniel Conrad said.

"He (was) aggressive in defensive play. He stood out today as a top player for us from the bench."

Scoring were Kyle Breth, 15 points including a pair of three pointers; Kelden Breth, 14 with four three pointers; Tyler Bruggeman, 12; Rayn May, 7; and Kennedy Fortin and Noah Nelson, 2 each.

Nelson had four assists, followed by Kyle and Kelden Breth and Kennedy Fortin, two each, and Bruggeman, Henningson and May, one each.

Bruggeman was the top rebounder with eight, followed by May and Nelson, four each; Kyle Breth, three, Kelden Breth and Konnor Fortin, two each; and Kennedy Fortin and Ganon Henningson, one each.

Kennedy Fortin had two blocked shots and Bruggeman had one. May made four steals while Kyle and Kelden Breth and Kennedy Fortin all made one each. Bruggeman made two free throws while Kyle Breth and May sank one each.

The boys played sixth in the tournament, giving them a 2-2 record and are 1-0 in the Northwest Kansas League with a victory over St. Francis in their first game of the season.

This week, Oberlin was to play Hill City at home on Tuesday. On Friday, the boys will be in Leoti to face the Wichita County Indians about 8 p.m., after the end of the girls game.
