The Oberlin Police Department worked this call last week:

There were no injuries and minimal damage. Dr. LaBash received a ticket for failure to yield.

City lifts ban, due to snow

After five to seven inches of snow last week, the City of Oberlin has lifted its burn ban.
"We were holding onto it because we were afraid something might get started," said City Administrator Karen Larson at Thursday's City Council meeting, "but now, with all the snow, do you want to take the burn ban off?"
The council members laughed while the motion was made and it carried unanimously. The city ban was put on the last week of June, just before wildfires tore through fields surrounding the town.
In other business, the council:
• Heard that the water permits for the city's new well field had been approved. The applications got a push from Rep. Ward Cassidy, said Mrs. Larson.
"They took some of our acre feet away and put in other places," she added, "so it's a little different than what we expected, but the total results were what we hoped for."
• Approved cereal malt beverage, or beer, license renewals for Raye's Grocery, AmPride, the Re-Load, Rick Salem's United Rebel Sprint Series and the Crossroads and Eagle convenience stores.
• Passed a motion to give credits of \$1,200 to the Sunflower Cinema and \$3,500 to the Decatur County Last Indian Raid Museum for their electric bills.
• Heard that Nex-Tech communications will have a new antenna put on the water tower by Jan. 2.
• Decided to hold a special council meeting to close out the year at 7 p.m. next Monday, Dec. 31.

• Decided that the council will meet that same night to begin rewriting the ordinance that deals with blighted property.
• Heard from Water Manager Willard Perrin about a water-main break at the intersection of Grand Avenue and Maple Street last Tuesday which left people nearby without water for four hours. He said lines for about three blocks from Commercial Street to Ash Street are in pretty poor condition.
"Are you suggesting another water project?" asked Mayor Rob McFee.
"The sooner the better," Mr. Perrin replied.
