Violet Marie Holle, 89, a sister of Eunice Martin of Oberlin, died Dec. 19, 2012, at the Good Samaritan So-

ciety Nursing Home in Atwood.

She was born Feb. 6, 1923, in rural Rawlins County at the home of her parents, Oscar Melvin and Vivian (Peterson) Anderson. She was baptized April 8, 1923, and confirmed Jan. 24, 1937, at the Enne Lutheran Church south of Herndon. She attended White Cloud School, then attended Decatur Community High School, where she graduated in 1941.

She received a normal training certificate by attending summer sessions at Fort Hays State University and Colorado State College of Education at Greeley. She had been an elementary school teacher in Decatur, Rawlins and Johnson counties.

She married Francis H. Holle on June 20, 1948, at the church. They lived on their family farm in southeast Rawlins County until retiring in 1992, when they moved to Atwood. In 1958, their farm received the Kansas Bankers Soil Conservation Award and in 1984, the couple was named Kansas Master Farmer/Master Farm Homemaker.

She had been a resident of the home since August 2007. She was a member of the Enne church, which later merged with Faith Lutheran Church in Oberlin. After moving to Atwood, she became a member of Redeemer Evangelical Lutheran Church.

She was a charter member of the Hello There Hobby Club and she and her husband helped organize the Cloverleaf 4-H Club. She served on the Rawlins County Extension Council executive board. In 1979, she was honored as a Kansas Merit Mother by the Kansas Mothers Association.

Survivors also include two sons, Larry Holle, Conifer, Colo., and Kevin (Mary) Holle, rural Herndon; two daughters, Shelly Holle, Chanute, and Cheryl Holle and

friend, Bob Keller, Kansas City, Mo.; another sister, Lila Thorson, Silverdale, Wash.; a sister-in-law, Carolyn Holle, Agra; a brother-in-law, Ernie Collard, East Wenatchee, Wash.; an aunt, Mildred Lider, Bellevue, Wash.; two grandsons; and four great-grandchildren.
