

# Oberlin wrestlers win own tournament

## Home team edges Smith Center boys

The Decatur Community High wrestlers won their own tournament on Saturday by just half a point.

Oberlin came in first with 147 points, followed closely by Smith Center, 146.5; Oakley 96; Goodland, 85; Wray, Colo., 73.5; McCook, 66; and Hill City, 57.5.

This year, instead of having regular brackets, most of the tournament was set up in a round-robin fashion, said high school activities director Joe Dreher, and each wrestler met everyone in his weight class.

The Red Devils had four tournament champions, as Troy Juenemann, Dayton Dreher, Chris Anderson and Channing Fortin won their weights. Oberlin also had three second-place finishers, a third and four wrestlers in fourth place.

Oberlin was outgunned from the first quarter, as the Lady Indians racked up 20 points to the Lady Red Devils' 8. In the second, Hoxie hit for 25 points to Oberlin's 18 to lead 45 to 26 at the half. The second half was more of the same, as Hoxie again scored 25 in the third period while Oberlin sank three two-pointers and a pair of free throws for 8 points. In the fourth, Hoxie shot for 10 to Oberlin's 5.

Scoring for Oberlin were Miki Dorshorst, 15 including a pair of three pointers; Demi Murray 11 including a three-point shot; Morgan Jansonius and Ara Marine, 4 each; Shawn Baker, 3 and Hannah May, 2.
