## Disaster loan deadline set

The final application date for emergency disaster loans for farmers and ranchers affected by drought last year in Decatur, Norton, and Phillips counties will be Tuesday, March 12

Pat L. Bohl, loan officer for the U.S. Farm Service Agency in Norton, advised that those needing farm credit as a result of the drought should make out an application at the agency's Norton County office, 11506 Pineview Dr.

"Loans covering physical or production losses are scheduled for repayment as rapidly as feasible, consistent with the applicant's ability to pay," he said, adding that the current interest rate is 2.125 percent, subject to monthly changes.

Loans covering physical losses may be used to replace installations, equipment, livestock or buildings (including homes). Those covering production losses may be used to buy feed, seed, fertilizer, livestock or to make payments on real estate and other debts.

"Funds can also be used for other essential operating and living expenses," Bohl added.

To be eligible, an applicant must be operating a family-size farm or ranch, unable to get credit elsewhere and must have suffered a qualifying loss, generally at least 30 percent of Farmers and ranchers that think

they may be eligible call (785) 877-5156 for information or advice.
