The Decatur Community High school boys basketball team ended its season with a 51-41 loss to Rock Hills in the first round of the substate tournament last Monday

The Red Devils, the eighth seed in the tournament, not only kept up with the Grizzlies in the first half, they led the scoring. But the Bears took control in the second half to win the game.

Oberlin took a 14-13 lead in the first quarter, and both teams scored 8 points in the second to give the Red Devils a 22-21 lead going into

In the third quarter, however, Rock Hills outscored Oberlin 11-7 and in the fourth, 19-12, to take

Bruggeman also had the most rebounds with six, followed by Kyle and Kelden Breth, May and Erickson, two each, and Noah Nelson and Fortin, one each.


