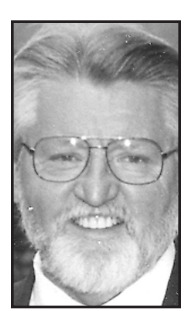

S. Cathcart

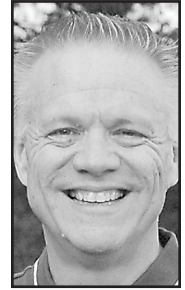
