Kathryn George Kathryn George, 93, a 1936 graduate of Decatur Community High School and a long-time teacher, died March 24, 2013, at the Colorado Plains Medical Center in Fort Morgan, Colo.

She was born Feb. 7, 1920, on her grandfather's homestead in Red Willow County, Neb., near Danbury, the daughter of Clyde and Rita Weyeneth. She earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in elementary education and a master's in special education from Colorado State College of Education in Greeley. She started teaching at the age of 16 in Decatur County and taught for more than 50 years.

Survivors include a grandson, Andrew (Kim) Lykins, Lafayette, Colo., and two great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her parents; daughters, Linda Ann and Mary Lykins, and sisters, Betty Bea and Bonnie Lea. Services will be at 11 a.m. today at the Rankin Presbyterian Church in Brush, Colo. Inurnment will follow at the McCook Memorial Cemetery. Dr. Alfred E. Krake Dr. Alfred E. Krake, 74, a physician in Oberlin in the 1960s, died March 26, 2013, at his home in Dry Prong, La.

He was a family physician for 50 years, and had been medical director of Christus Cabrini clinics and was a former coroner of Grant Parish, La. As a graduate of Louisiana State University, the Louisiana State Medical School and the Johns Hopkins School of Public Health, he mentored many young medical professionals throughout his career. He served in the Public Health Services for 24 years, retiring as a captain. He was a deacon and Sunday school teacher at the First Baptist Church of Dry Prong, and was a member of the Gideons.

Survivors include his wife of 54 years, Geraldine Jones Krake, and a son, Allen A. Krake, Dry Prong; a daughter, Pamela Krake (Sal) Bernadas, Watson, La.; four brothers, Albert E. (Nat) Krake, Baton Rouge; Joseph W. (Mary) Krake, Concord, Calif.; Max (Elizabeth) Krake, Zachary, La.; and Charles R. (Lena) Krake, Houston; and a sister, Faye Krake, Zachary.
