ORDINANCE NO. 860
AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING ELECTRICAL RATES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF OBERLIN, KANSAS, that:

Section One: The rate for electric current supplied by the city shall be at the rate of \$0.138 per kilowatt hour with all customers paying an additional demand charge of \$7 per month per residential meter and \$12 per month per non-residential meter.

Section Two: These rates shall be effective for the billings occurring on and after May 1, 2013, which includes usage during part of March and April.

Section Three: All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section Four: This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.
