

Art students win best of show

Winter Polivka, Trae Woolsey and Weston Barnes won Best of Show awards at the Northwest Kansas League Art Show.

Winter won Best of Show in the high school division for her self-portrait watercolor of her eyes. The judge said Winter's portrait had "beautiful details," was "very expressive" and an "excellent technical touch."

Trae's Best of Show for grades fifth through seventh was for his 2-dimensional mixed media of a dragon head. The judge said his composition was "very good," he had "great use of color" and "strong craftsmanship."

Acrayon tri-panel piece won Best of Show for Weston in the elementary division, grades kindergarten through fourth. The judge said Weston used "lots of wonderful detail" and had "great use of color and imagination."

Several Oberlin art students also won blue ribbons at the art show. In the K-4 division, 12 students won blue ribbons: Jesse Isbell, watercolor; Taylor Ketterl, snowman; Logan Hayward, crayon hands; Adrien Hawkins, construction paper sculpture; Kaitlyn Howland, mixed media; Taite Woolsey, two blue ribbons for a crayon sun and mixed media; Joshua Russ, two blue ribbons, a jellyfish and cut paper fish; Reece Grafel, mixed design; Ryan Ketterl, mixed (blue-green); Trennedey Woolsey, watercolor lacey design; Rayne Erickson, crayon


vacation scene; and Bailey Powers, torn paper artwork.

In the grades 5-7 division, 11 students won blue ribbons: Amy Wentz, mixed media; Reegon Witt, two blue ribbons for a sharks drawing and a watercolor; Lily Marine-Singleton, three blue ribbons, black and white marker design, batik peace feather and a black and white design; Genna Randel, watercolor of flowers; Brittney Wesley, watercolor; Zeke Jimenez, weaving; Cassidy Gillespie, the image of a bug created by using small dots of color; Kennedy Jensen, mixed media flower; Alissa Sporn, mixed media of a spotted pink flower; Andrew Macki, batik; and Trae Woolsey, wide wing.

Six students won blue ribbons in the high school division: Kassidie Jensen, an ink design; Demi Murray, clay dish; Cassandra Canto, four blue ribbons for a clay tree stump, colored pencil drawing of a lizard, a watercolor pencil of a hooded figure, and mixed media batik design; McKenna O'Hare, five blue ribbons for a picture of a bird and a turtle, both created with dots, a watercolor self-portrait, an acrylic painting, and a pencil drawing; Taylor Macfee, a marker design; and Winter Polivka, two blue ribbons for a mixed media of a flower and a marker design.

The art teacher for grades kindergarten through 12 is Terri Woolsey.
