## Rea E. Magers

Rea E. Magers, 86, a 1947 graduate of Decatur Community High School, died Friday, May 17, 2013, at the Norton County Hospital.

He was born Nov. 14, 1926, in Decatur County, the son of James A. and Anna E. (Burian) Magers. He grew up on the family farm and attended rural grade school. He served in the U.S. Army.

He married Deloris "Dee" Hahn on July 19, 1951, in New Almelo. They lived in Chicago while he was attending the American Television Institute of Technology. He received a Bachelor of Science degree in engineering. The couple moved to Denver, where he started a television-repair business. He then found a job at Channel 9, running the first color camera.

He later was an aerospace engineer in guidance control with Martin Marietta (now Lockheed Martin), helping to put the first men on the moon. After retirement, the couple returned to the Norcat area in 1984, where they operated the Red Roof Ped'ler. He was a member of the St. Francis Catholic Church in Norton.

Survivors include his wife, Dee, Norcat; a daughter, Cheryl (Rob-

ert) Pomeroy, Lakewood, Colo.; a son, Jeff Magers, and companion, Joy Luoto, Cedar Bluffs; three grandchildren; a great-granddaughter; and three sisters-in-law, Margaret "Toots," Wilma and Dorothy Magers.

He was preceded in death by his parents and three brothers, Ralph, Carl, and Dale Magers.

A rosary service was scheduled for 7 p.m. Tuesday at the Enfield

Funeral Home in Norton. Mass of Christian Burial will be at 10 a.m. today at St. Joseph Catholic Church in New Almelo with the Rev. Vincent Thu Lang officiating and burial in the church cemetery.

A memorial was established in his name to the Norcat City Alliance, in care of the funeral home, 315 W. Main, Norton, Kan., 67654.
