Gaynor V. Carlson

Gaynor Vincent Carlson, 83, a native of the Midway area in Rawlins County, and founder of two Atwood businesses, died at his home in McPherson on Friday, May 24, 2013.

He was born Dec. 30, 1929, in rural Herndon, the son of Roy Edward and Florence Marie (Nelson) Carlson. He was baptized at the Enne Lutheran Church. He attended the Linda school in Rawlins County and Decatur Community High School. He attended Colby Community College and graduated from television repair school in Louisville, Ky.

He married Helena Fitts on June 16, 1956, in Louisville and she died May 29, 2008.

He started two companies, Carlson Industries of Atwood, still operated by his son, Vincent, and the Bell and Carlson Rifle Stock Co., which he sold. Bell and Carlson has since moved to Dodge City. He held five U.S. patents on inventions. He was a member of the Lions and Rotary Clubs and the First Christian Church while living in Atwood.

Survivors include his children, Vincent (Gayle) Carlson, rural Oberlin, and Carla (Jerry) Barber, McPherson; a step-daughter, Brenda Dinger, Jeffersonville, Ind.; a sister, Lorraine Murray, Evans, Colo.; a brother-in-law, Herschel Masters, Derby; a sister-in-law, Audrey (Paul) Thompson, New London, N.C.; four grandchildren; five step-grandchildren; 12 step-great-grandchildren; and a step-great-great-grandchild.

He was also preceded in death by his parents; three sisters, Bernadine (Wilbur) Hare, Pauline Masters and Leona Gamblin; a brother, Delbert (Ruth) Carlson; a sister-in-law, Sandra Lawrence and a step-son, Eddie Brickey.

Funeral services will be at 10 a.m. today at the Glidden-Ediger Chapel

in McPherson with the Rev. Harry Grinstead officiating. Graveside services will follow at 4 p.m. at Fairview Cemetery in Atwood with the Rev. Mike McVay officiating.
