Opal Irene Bryan, 92, a lifelong resident of Decatur County, died Wednesday, May 29, 2013, at the Decatur County Good Samaritan Center in Oberlin.

She was born Dec. 25, 1920, on a farm seven miles northwest of Oberlin, the daughter of Walter and Gertrude (Oxley) Castle. She attended Hillsdale School No. 55 and graduated from Decatur Community High School in 1937. She then completed a Normal Training Course and taught school in Decatur County while attending Fort Hays State College in Hays.

She married Victor G. Bryan on Nov. 9, 1941, at the United Methodist Church in Oberlin. The couple purchased a farm in 1942 and later moved a house onto the land. She began working for the Farmers Loan and Abstract Co. in Oberlin in November 1960. The couple sold their farm and moved to Oberlin on Aug. 26, 1993.

She was a member of the United Methodist Church, the United Methodist Women, the Calico Gals and Zeta Nu.

Survivors include her daughters, Sharon (Marvin) Slabaugh, Ober-

lin, and Jeanne Britton, Thornton, Colo.; a brother, Walt (Joanne) Castle, Oberlin; five grandchildren; six great-grandchildren; and three great-great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband, on Dec. 3, 2006; a son-in-law, Carlos Britton; a sister, Grace Hoppas; and a brother-in-law, Virgil Hoppas.

Services were Tuesday morning at Pauls Funeral Home in Oberlin. The Rev. Nancy Proffitt officiated and burial was in the Oberlin Cemetery.
