

# Swimmers travel to Oakley for league meet

The Oberlin Swim Club came in fifth at the Oakley Swim Meet on Saturday.

Coach Stephanie Blau said that the team took 27 swimmers to the Northwest Kansas League meet. Goodland won the meet with 307 points, followed by Colby 228, Holyoke, Colo., 165, Wray, Colo., 162, Oberlin 160.5, Burlington, Colo., 114, Oakley 83.5 and Flagler, Colo., 36.
