Team remains undefeated

Black Gold continues to lead the Decatur County Recreation program's co-ed softball league with eight wins and no losses as of Sunday, while Farmers Bank and Trust leads the coach-pitch standings with six wins and no losses.

Last week, Black Gold beat the Legion 15-7 and edged E&R Trucking 18-17 on Tuesday while E&R downed Stallman Construction 16-1 and the Legion beat Stallman 19-15.

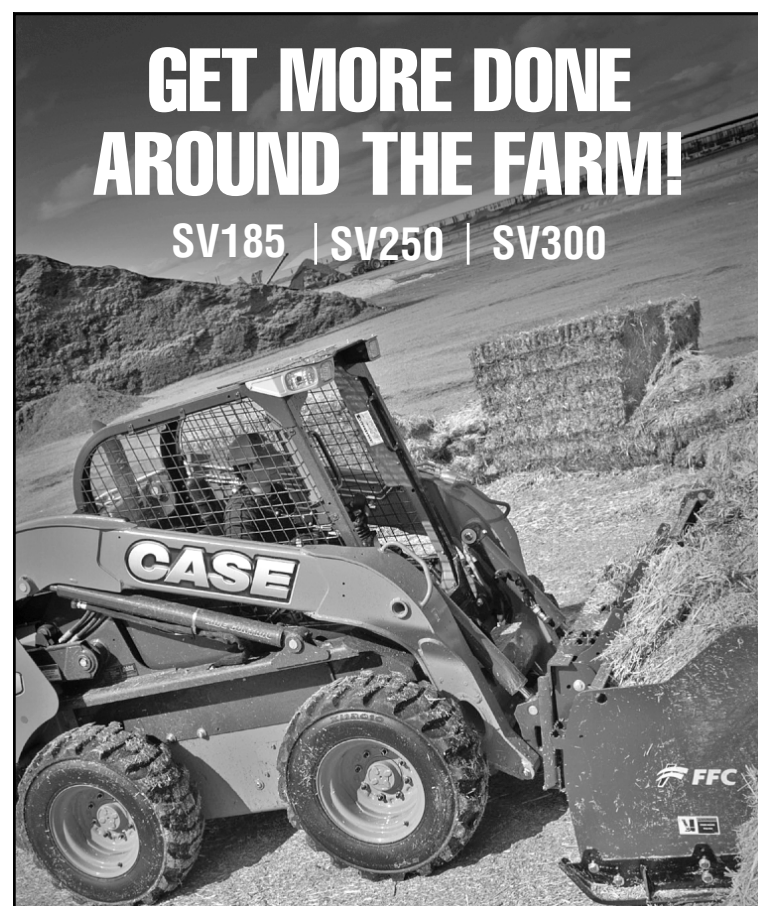
