Rodney Lee Stapp

Rodney Lee Stapp, 72, a 1959 graduate of Norcat High School, died Saturday, July 27, 2013, at the Norton County Hospital.

He was born Feb. 21, 1941, at the home of his paternal grandparents northwest of Norcat, the son of Donald and Goldie (Kolsky) Stapp.

He was one of the five members of his graduating class. He served in the U.S. Army from 1959 to 1962, during which time the Cuban Missile Crisis occurred. He was stationed in Germany for two and one-half years and was able to see much of the country which he enjoyed.

He married Delores McCulloch on Dec. 28, 1965, in Clinton, Okla. They made their home in

Norcat and Norton where he spent the last 38 years as a cattle buyer. He cherished his relationship with clients, competing bidders and auction personnel.

He was a member of the United Methodist Church of Norcat and the Kansas Livestock Association.

Survivors include his wife, Delores Stapp, Norton; his mother, Goldie Stapp, Oberlin; two daughters, Janelle (Pat) Morel, Norton, and LeAnn (Jim) Hansen, Wichita; four grandchildren, and two brothers, Larry (Marcia) Stapp, Holcomb, and Garry (Barb) Stapp, Ord, Neb.

He was preceded in death by his father.

Home in Norton. The Rev. Rick Rostek will officiate and burial will be in the Norcat Cemetery.

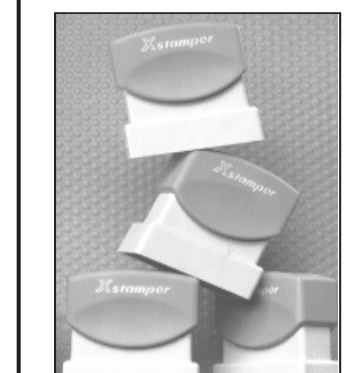
